Goal: To familiarize 3rd-5th graders with the Medieval themes of architecture/ art and legends.

Objective: Students will understand art concepts of gargoyles, illumination and stain glass.

Objective: Students will be able to recount legends of dragons, knights and castles.

Concepts:

Clear correlation between topic and images and between text and illustrations.

Following brief directions.

Coordination with juggling activity.

Exploring topics for discovery purposes.

Use hyperlinks to explore the Internet.

The annotated bibliography will also serve as a checklist/content list (for both patrons and library staff)—the visuals of the resources will help students and parents in returning items to the box. This content list will be on library website so that students can just click on hyperlinks. Upon checkout library staff should review the content list and how student can use it to fully explore the topic.
